Language Development. Figure 1. Reading to young children helps them develop language skills by hearing and using new vocabulary words. A child's vocabulary expands between the ages of two to six from about 200 words to over 10,000 words through a process called fast-mapping . Words are easily learned by making connections between new words and concepts already known.

The importance of language development in early childhood

A new study finds that a home environment that supports language development in early childhood—across the first four years of life—predicts children's readiness to learn in pre-school, which in turn predicts the children's academic skills in fifth grade (age 10-11). The study focused on low-income families.

Home environment supports language development in early ...

The acquisition of language is one of the more remarkable achievements of early childhood. By age 5, children essentially master the sound system and grammar of their language and acquire a vocabulary of thousands of words.

The first 3 years of life, when the brain is developing and maturing, is the most intensive period for acquiring speech and language skills.
