Infant Mortality In Enfield

Often associated with infant mortality, obstructed labor can also lead to maternal mortality. Obstructed labor occurs when a blockage prevents the infant from properly exiting the womb. While many obstetrics teams are well-trained in managing obstructed labor to ensure infant survival, complications for the mother—including eclampsia and hemorrhages—often go undetected.

Reducing Maternal Mortality: Steps To Improve Outcomes

Since the implementation of BHB in 2009, the city's infant mortality rate has declined by 38 percent - from 13.5 deaths per 1,000 live births in 2009 to 8.4 in 2015 (Figure 1). This decline was most pronounced for African Americans, whose infant

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mortality rate decreased by 50 percent. The teen birth rate also dropped by 36 percent. Figure 1.

The maternal mortality ratio (estimated at 269 in 2014) would reduce to 210 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births. The maternal mortality rate (deaths per 10,000 women 15-49 years)

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reduces from 21/10,000 in 2014, to 12/10,000. Increasing family planning by 0.68 percentage points per year averted an additional 600 maternal deaths in 2030.

Scaling Up Family Planning to Reduce Maternal and Child

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Worldwide, accelerated progress is required to achieve Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) 4 (reduce child mortality) and 5 (improve maternal health) as highlighted in the United Nations Secretary-General's Global Strategy for Women's and Children's Health. 1 There have been substantial achievements from 1990 (the baseline for the MDGs) to date.

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
